SHOW RULES

- 1 ENTRIES will be accepted from any member of the society, but no exhibitor may stage more than 1 entry in any 1 class from the same garden, except in FLORAL ART and COOKERY CLASSES.
- 2 All exhibits in the FLOWER, FRUIT and VEGETABLE classes must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 3 POT PLANTS must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least TWO months prior to the show.
- 4 Member means paid up member, husband or wife of the member, children related to the member.
- 5 All entries must be received by the SHOW SECRETARY not later than WEDNESDAY 08th September Exhibitors are asked to ensure that their entry forms are correctly completed, as mistakes cannot be rectified.
- 6 Late entries will be accepted, EXCEPT in classes 77 to 81 (floral art), **before 11am** on the day of the show.
- 7 The judges' decision is final. Prize money or awards may be withheld if exhibits are considered to be unworthy of the prize offered.
- 8 PRIZE MONEY will be available for collection on show day between 3.30 and. 4.15pm, any exhibit or prize money **NOT** collected by 4.30 pm will become the property of the Society.
- 9 STAGING. The show will be open for staging from **9 am**. An exhibitor's card must be obtained from the Show Secretary, and placed face downwards with each exhibit. Please name varieties if possible to stimulate interest.
- 10 JUDGING. This will commence at **12 noon**. Only authorised persons are allowed in the hall during judging.
- 11 SOCIETY AWARDS will be presented at 4.15pm.
- 12 Containers will NOT be supplied for SECTION H (floral art). Vases will be provided where applicable and must be used.
- 13 All exhibits in SECTIONS A, B, C, D, & F will be donated to worthy causes unless an offer is made to purchase. RESERVED SECTIONS are E, G, H & I, (DOMESTIC, HANDICRAFT, FLORAL ART and CHILDREN'S) Classes 44 - 47 (POT PLANTS). Exhibitors may start to remove their exhibits at **4pm**
- 14 POINTS. Points will be awarded on the basis of five points for first, three points for second, and one point for third. In the event of a tie, the award will be given to the exhibitor with the most firsts etc.
- 15 All cups to be held for one year, and must be returned to the Show Secretary by the end of JULY 2022.
- 16 A NOVICE is a person NOT having won the BALMORE CUP three times.

63	CARROT CAKE WITH WALNUTS. 350g (12oz) raw carrots, peeled and finely grated, 225ml (8fl oz) sunflower or corn oil, 275g (9oz) plain flour 1tsp bicarbonate of soda, 1½tsp baking powder, 1½tsp ground cinnamon, 4 large eggs, 300g (10oz) granulated sugar, 2tsp vanilla extract, 100g (3½oz) walnuts, chopped. FOR THE ICING. 100g (3½oz) soft cheese, room temperature, 25g (1oz) unsalted butter, room temperature, 250g icing sugar, sifted, 1tsp vanilla extract, zest of 1 lemon, finely grated. Preheat the oven to Gas 4, 180°C, fan 160°C. Grease and line the base of a 20cm (8in) round cake tins. Mix the carrots and oil together in a bowl and set aside. Sift together the flour, bicarbonate of soda, baking powder and ground cinnamon. Set aside. Beat the eggs until frothy. Gradually whisk in the sugar and beat for 3-4 minutes until the batter is thick and creamy. Add the vanilla extract and the flour mixture and beat until just incorporated. Fold in the carrot, oil mixture and walnuts. Place the batter into the cake tin and bake on the centre oven shelf for 60-75 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the centre comes out clean. After around 45 minutes place a sheet on tin foil over the cake if browning on top too much. Remove from oven and let cool on a wire rack for 10 minutes. Turn the cake onto the wire rack, remove the tin and lining paper. Cool completely before icing. To make the icing, beat the cream cheese and butter with an electric mixer until smooth. Gradually add the icing sugar, mixing on low speed. Beat in the vanilla extract and lemon zest. Spread the top of the cake with the icing.
